

TN – NASHVILLE -- NEW 68-UNIT PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IN NASHVILLE FIRST IN 18 YEARS

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (WKRN) – City officials will break ground Friday on a new, 86-unit public housing building in east Nashville, making it the first in 18 years.

Mayor Karl Dean and the Metropolitan Development and Housing Agency (MDHA) will hold the ceremony at 10:30 a.m. at 544 Summer Place.

The new Cayce Place Apartments is part of phase one of the [MDHA's plan to rebuild Cayce Place](#) and transform it into a mixed-use, mixed-income community.

Overall, the [Envision Cayce Redevelopment Plan](#) includes 2,390 units. They plan to build one, move people into it, then tear down the old and build another on a one-for-one basis.
